The Red-backed Salamander (Plethodon cinereus) is one of the most common salamanders in our EcoRegion, and across the eastern US. It is 2-4" long, with a dark body and a distinctive wide red stripe running from its head to its tail. There is also a "leadback" color morph, which is only dark grey.

These salamanders are found under rotting logs in wooded areas, especially those of paper birch. When frightened, they will "drop" their tail; it wiggles frenetically while the salamander escapes.

Most salamanders lay their eggs in water, but these salamanders lay their eggs under decomposing logs. To keep them moist, the mother curls around the eggs until they hatch. After hatching and leaving their nest, red-backeds hunt small invertebrates, especially ants. They are lungless, breathing entirely from air filtering through their skin, and spend the winters dormant in underground tunnels.
