### *From the Pastor*

Dear Faithful Friends,

I can only imagine that you, like me, are delighted that we have slid from winter to spring! Today I see crocus shooting up on the lawn and snow drops in the church garden. The "little sewing girl" is with us in the garden for another year and is greeting the spring birds and the warmer temperatures.

Dorrie and I and Penny are back from a mid-March vacation on the Cape – all of us rejuvenated from walks on the bike bath and runs on the beach. I am grateful for these weeks away. They make a difference for the long haul of faithful ministry. Thank you to Rev, Kate Stevens who filled in for me and for all of you dear friends for being who you are.

Are you enjoying the Grace Abounds daily devotional? I appreciate the variety of voices and meditations and prayers including this one. "O Jesus Christ, enter our lives, change our hearts, and reorient us to better things. Give us life and call us again to follow you. Amen."

That is what Lent (and Easter) is to me. A good long time to reorient, to welcome Jesus into my heart and with the help of God and you, to see better things. Especially in this time of strife and war, and a worldwide pandemic, it is hard to keep our sight on good things. This time of Lent and soon Easter gives us the chance to practice seeing the Light of Christ, even when it is dim and darkening. We cannot ignore the sorrow and pain of life on our planet. We can take that very sorrow and pain, those crosses, and bring them into the Light of Love. I call that abounding grace. Some others call it salvation.

This year we will walk with Jesus through his last days on earth. We start with Palm Sunday worship, remembering that last year we worshipped from home! Then we proceed to our

Maundy Thursday Tenebrae Service on Thursday April 14 at 6:30. We will not set up tables for a "last supper" in the sanctuary, but we will listen to the words of the Passion and to meditative music while we watch the light dim to darkness. Then, because after all we are Easter people, we will go out into the quiet night, expectant for what will come next.

On Good Friday, from noon to three, we will have music playing in the Sanctuary for those who would like to pray alone or with a friend. On Easter morning we will have a 6 am Easter Sunrise service on the lawn outside the church. Who knows, maybe we will even have a little Easter Sunrise coffee hour? Finally at 10 am our church will come alive with flowers and a choir and all of us singing Alleluia!

Easter arrives this year on Sunday April 17, but Eastertide is 50 days! Longer than Lent because there are more stories to tell, more songs to sing, more hope to rise up and share with the world. Darkness meets the dawn. Love, that came to birth in Bethlehem is still on the move, even after Good Friday.

Indeed, as our Lenten devotional attests, we will pray on Easter, "O wondrous God, who raised your beloved Son from hell's grasp, fill us with joy, on this festival day, that we might tell all the world that Christ is risen from the dead. Amen.

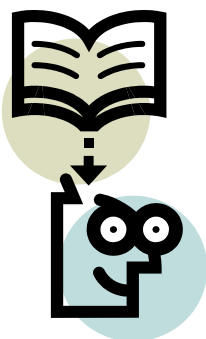

## COMMUNITY CLOTHES CLOSET

St. Pauly Textile, Inc., the company that oversees our clothing shed for the Community Clothes Closet at Cowell Gymnasium, reports that in 2021, 28,871 pounds of clothing was donated from our shed. That is enough to clothe an estimated 5,318 people around the world. Based on this volume, Trinity's Clothes Closet mission received \$1,155.

## CROP WALK 2021 REPORT

We donated \$1,725! As part of this walk, our Friday night Community Meal recently received a check for a bit over \$1600. That is almost the amount we raised. Amazing!

We have received information from Adam Smedberg, our Church World Service CROP WALK Engagement Specialist, reporting that The Franklin County CROP WALK is listed as number 78 out of the 500 CROP WALKS in the nation of last year. Your contributions of prayer, time, money, walking, helped to make this possible.

Monies raised nation- wide provided a mobile health unit in Haiti in response to an earthquake that damaged a community's hospital and several medical facilities.

Also, in Vietnam, in a school with limited bathroom facilities, CROP WALK money funded a team from Church World Service to go there, modernize the facility to better handle the number of students using it.

Trinity Church will participate in the 2022 CROP Walk again this year. The date is Sunday, October 2. It will be held at the United Methodist Church in Greenfield, so we know there are no hills involved. Let's raise more money this year for this worthy cause.
