with me. My hope is that our liturgy and our fellowship will shape us over the next weeks, months, years, and (God willing) throughout our whole lives, into a joyful people equipped to seed hope, seek justice, and make peace.

This helps in the decomposition process, and keeps the insects to a minimum.

Isn't it amazing how garbage and garden refuse, layered with water and soil, make this beautiful soil.

Wes Rice is donating his tumbling composter to Trinity, to use in place of the current black composter. This will enable the compost to decompose quicker, as it can be turned when adding garbage, etc. Turning compost introduces air, which keeps odor and insects away. Thank you, Wes.

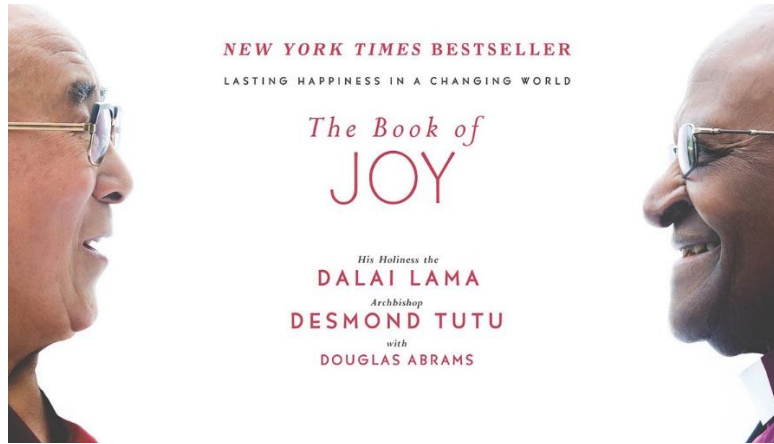
