Light your candles, inside and out, and the world will give thanks.



We have chosen, as our goal, the reduced use of plastic both in our homes and here in the church building. Toward that goal, we would like to propose that we use ceramic coffee cups instead of styrofoam or plastic, beginning right away. They can be put in the dishwasher after coffee hour to clean and sanitize for the next week. We hope you can support this by bringing any extra coffee cups to the church kitchen. We need about 30. We will figure out where to store them.

We also have switched to using glass communion cups instead of the plastic or paper ones. Again, these can be washed, thus saving the planet one more bit.

It is all of us, striving to do as much as we can to reduce the use of plastic and other non-biodegradable items that help restore our beautiful earth to health.

Kate Stevens will be leading a group called "Being and Believing" on a bi-monthly basis for the next few months. The group will be held Thursday mornings at 10 a.m. on the first and third Thursdays of the month, beginning December 7.
