Dear Trinity,

Welcome to Advent, a season of preparation, longing, and hope. Just when the world is asking us to speed up, go shopping, decorate, attend holiday parties, and travel; the Church is calling us to slow down, take a breath, check in with ourselves, and open our hearts to God. Oh, how challenging this can be! Our lives, with work, church, family, and other activities, were full even before we had to start our Christmas shopping, decorating, and holiday events and somewhere in between all of that, we're asked to take more time, to slow down, to be still? Yes. And while I have you here, let's take a quick moment now. Seriously – **stop reading** – the rest of the newsletter will be here waiting for you to finish it later. Just take a moment to close your eyes. Take a deep breath in through your nose, and as you slowly exhale, imagine you're letting go of all of the stress, anxiety, hurt, or fear that you may be carrying. Did you try it? How did it feel? What did you notice? When I do small actions like this, it reminds me that I'm not being asked to stop living life in order to make room for God, but rather it's about inviting God to enter into my life. It's about taking a few moments throughout the day to seek that connection with God. And it's about reminding myself that God is a constant, loving presence ready to fill an open heart.

If all you did this Advent was read this newsletter article and try the breathing activity I offered you, that would be enough. If you are seeking to devote more time to this Advent journey, the Church is offering several different opportunities for you throughout this season. Below you'll find our full schedule. I pray that this Advent season is a blessing to you and that you're reminded this Christmas of the greatest gift of all – God's love.


All money donations and gift donations need to be at church by December 15.

Nancy Parland will lead Christmas Caroling on the Baptist Lot! Saturday, December 14 at 1 p.m.


A fire, songbooks and hot cocoa will be provided.
