From the Pastor

Dear Faithful Friends,

I am writing this letter to you a few days before Christmas. As I write this, knowing that you will receive it after that special day I am thinking about the Apostle Paul. We know Paul primarily through his letters, or epistles. He wrote to teach and inspire and encourage the new Christians who at that time were often called People of the Way. His letters did not get to travel at cyber speed or even postal service speed. My guess is that they were carried by hand, passed from one traveler to another, and arrived "after the fact." And still, at his best, they were indeed spirited and encouraging.

So here I am, in the last days of Advent, writing to you. Today I do not know now how our candlelight service will go – who will come and who will not. I do not know how our towns will be faring in the pandemic by the time you get this. I imagine that many of your will be at least a bit, if not a lot, weary, as winter, never mind Christmastide, takes a lot out of us. And I hope that the Light that shone on Jesus as an infant and throughout his life, death, and resurrection, is shining in your hearts. No matter what.

Paul was, if nothing else, faithful. He was not certain. He was not overly optimistic. He who had "seen the Lord" in a vision but not in person, was heavy on trust and faith. As we walk through Christmastide now and into the season of Epiphany, we too get to practice faithfulness which to me is all about staying with what and who (the good, the bad, the ugly and the magnificent) is in front of us and knowing deep in our heart that God is out and about in our world and is guiding us, holding us, and loving us. On January 23rd we will be holding our Annual Meeting, to look back at 2021 and onward to 2022.

As of this writing I do not know if we will be able to meet in person or on Zoom. I am greatly encouraged that we will be having a new members service on Sunday January 9th. It is a very good thing that our church body is growing and changing, as that is what we are asked to do as People of the Way.

Paul, in his letters always began with an introduction of who he was and a call to those to whom he was writing. So let me begin again.

Dear faithful friends, I Marguerite, a servant of Jesus the Christ, called to be your pastor, set apart for the gospel of God, and sent to the church of God that is in Shelburne Falls, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, grace to you and peace and strength in this new year. I give thanks to God always for you, not because of who you are, and not because of what you have done or not done but because of this precious grace of God, given to us all, today and every day.

May the New Year call you forward to be gentle of heart and faithful to the Way of Peace.

We will celebrate the Epiphany on Sunday January 2. Here is one of the Wise Ones!


The season of Epiphany goes on for many weeks. Thank goodness, as we certainly need all the "aha!" that we can get in our world.





