Hi friends,

I'm in Naples, Italy with my twin goddaughters and their parents. We've had just one full day but here are a few things that I've learned:

Italy, of course, is a Catholic country - 80% of population we were told - but in the largest of all their churches, (over 450 in Naples) in the middle of the historical center of the city and in the center of the altar, is featured a very large relief sculpture of the assumption of Mary, (the elevation of Mary's body to heavenly glory). Perhaps you remember my saying that Mary was worshipped in the Catholic Church and largely ignored in the Protestant church? That's what I have been seeing.

Also nativity scenes are everywhere here. Some of them are of the birth scene, often in a partially torn down temple signifying the beginning of the end of the Roman Empire. But many of them are nativity scenes of a restaurant or a family. People bring them home as works of art, which they are. All the figures are hand made and they are beautiful.

I shall be back the 8th of January after a few more days here and then about a week in Rome. I wish you all and the world a healthy and peaceful new year.

Kate Stevens is leading a group called "Being and Believing" on a bi-monthly basis for the next few months. The group meets Thursday mornings at 10 a.m. on the first and third Thursdays of the month. The next get together is Thursday, on January 11.
