Joy to The World! We hope all of your Christmas Celebrations have been Blessed and filled with many special memories! We at Trinity Church certainly had a wonderful Month. Thanks to Nancy Parland for leading a Carol Sing on the Baptist lot on December 14th. The music was amazing and all were kept warm with the fire pit manned by Steve. On December 21st Ben lead a very moving Blue Christmas service for those who carry pain or loss during this season of Celebration. Parishioners who wished were able to light candles to recognize a loss or a burden. On Christmas Eve 80 plus people enjoyed a Beautiful Candlelight service with lessons and carols and the Bringing out the Christ Child to the Creche. Thank you to Keith Rollinson and The Trinity Choir for their amazing music that night and during the Sunday services. We are especially grateful to Pastor Ben for making our Sunday services and these special services leading up to Christmas and now Epiphany truly reminiscent!

The Leadership team has been working on developing a fragrance-free policy along with Pastor Ben. We have placed this new policy in our Sunday Bulletin for a few Sundays and plan to have the policy listed on the Trinity Website, in The Quest and in The Two Town News. Thanks to Lois Bascom who is helping with the formation of a new creation care team that will focus on making Trinity more environmentally friendly, starting with our cleaning products. The Leadership team has agreed to Pastor Ben's suggestion to now use Gluten free bread for our Communion Services, as well his idea to switch out our guest book to one that includes e-mails and phone numbers for better follow-up. Gratefully he will also be designing new pew cards as we do not have any more of our old ones.

Tom Williams joined as a guest for our last meeting. Tom is a member of Trinity and is the Emergency Management Director for Shelburne. Ben spoke about getting a request from The Mary Lyon Foundation as well as the Opioid Task force asking whether Trinity Church might consider joining Arms Library and The Senior Center in becoming a Warming Center. Tom reported that there have been discussions regarding the possibility of using Cowell Gym, who have already been working on structural changes, as a Warming and Cooling Shelter with Trinity providing meals. A generator would need to be purchased at each site. Tom stated he has had a lot of training in these areas and can answer further questions and help us to move this idea forward. More information on this will follow as progress transpires.

Thanks goes out to Pat Valeski for replacing our shades as well as to him and Brook for helping to fix the heat in the Narthex and the outside sidewalk. Trinity Church has opened its doors to a new group. Recover Project is now using our space on Tuesday afternoons from 1-3 p.m. We are also happy to report that Lifepath's Health Eating/Cooking class will be returning to our kitchen sometime soon. We have also purchased a new smart TV system to help these event managers and others with presentations. Trinity will be hosting The Community Meal on January 17th. 
