From Pastor Benjiman Durfee

Dear Trinity,

A couple of weeks ago, I attended the Cultivating Resilience meeting led by Tricia Yacavone-Biagi here at Trinity Church. At this meeting, we watched a video and discussed the Japanese concept of *Ibasho*. Our discussion resonated deeply with me, and I believe that this concept holds a powerful lesson for our life together as a church and as members of our wider community. Ibasho loosely translates to "a place where one feels at home," or better yet, "a place where one feels they truly belong."

In Japanese culture, Ibasho refers not just to a physical location, but to a space—often emotional or spiritual—where you can simply be yourself, without fear, without pretense, without performance. It's the kind of place where you're not only accepted, but beloved. Doesn't that sound like what church is meant to be?

One of the things that really struck me in the video was how these communities are intergenerational. In our western culture, age is often dismissed. But the church is unique in that we are knit together into the body of Christ across generations. Our elders are living testimonies of God's love, while our younger generations bring their questions, energy, and longing. It made me wonder: how could we become even more intentional about honoring our elders, not just with words, but with time and attention? And how can we create more spaces where generations can learn from each other – not just through programs, but through relationships?

It brought my mind to our Friday night meal on the 16th. Beth's grandchildren were there to help, along with a few of us middle-somethings, and a few seniors: it was truly intergenerational! It was beautiful to see us all work together and build relationships along the way. It was adorable to see the young ones be so eager to help, and I'm sure they looked up to their grandmother and the other elders present as they guided them through the preparation and serving.

I think that Jesus modeled this beautifully. He honored the wisdom of tradition while making space for people of all ages to find their place in God's story. He didn't just teach along the way; he created Ibasho wherever he went. And so can we.

Thursday Night AA

The Shelburne Falls Big Book Study Group of AA meets every Thursday evening from 7:00-8:00pm at Trinity Church. This is an open meeting. Open meetings are available to anyone interested in Alcoholics Anonymous' program of recovery from alcoholism. Nonalcoholics may attend open meetings as observers.

Friday All Recovery Meeting and Drop-In Recovery Coach Support

All Recovery Meetings are non-denominational and are open to all pathways to recovery. Meeting format is focused on peer support and invites participants to reflect on and share what they are doing for their recovery. Recovery Coaches offer 1:1 support to people in substance use recovery to build their recovery capital. The Drop-in Recovery Coach Support is held at Trinity Church on Friday evenings from 6:30-7:30pm followed by a hybrid (Zoom and In-Person) All Recovery Meeting at 7:30-8:30pm. All Recovery Meetings and Coaches are coordinated by The Recover Project of Greenfield.
