#### From Pastor Benjiman Durfee

Dear Trinity,

How special it was to celebrate our first Holy Week and Easter Sunday together! Every year we celebrate Easter, and yet every year something different resonates with me. This year, prompted by our Lenten book study, the idea of the Church embodying the risen Christ has really taken hold of me. On Easter Sunday, I preached about how on Maundy Thursday, we didn't just receive the body of Christ, but in that act, just as with the first disciples, Christ invites us to embody him and become his living presence in this world. That's a powerful image! And it reminds me that Easter is not just a one-and-done day each year, but it's a reminder that every day we are called to embody Christ in the world.

I again felt that resurrection spirit as we set out on our Earth Day Walk around Shelburne Falls the following Sunday. It was a beautiful opportunity to allow the Earth to speak to us with its timeless beauty and signs of Spring, but it was also an opportunity for us to practice being an Easter people as we picked up trash around town.

As we were walking, the most pervasive litter we found were cigarette butts. Alison Cornish was walking next to me as we bent down to pick some up and she asked if I knew that cigarette butts were nonbiodegradable. She explained that, even though we think they're made from natural paper and cotton, they're actually made from plastic cellulose acetate fiber that can take 10 years to decompose! I was intrigued (horrified?) and researched more when I got home and learned that cigarette butts

are the most littered item on Earth, with roughly 4.5 *trillion* being tossed <u>each year</u>. That means that by the time one cigarette butt decomposes, another 45 trillion are littered in its place. (Case in point, right after I got back from the walk, I witnessed someone throw their cigarette butt out their car window!) Not only is this unsightly, but they make their way into our waterways, harming animals that mistake them for food, and leaching their chemicals into the environment.

My point is that, while we didn't collect a mountain of trash on our walk, we probably collected dozens of cigarette butts, which mitigated even the slightest fraction of the harm that they do to the Earth and her creatures. By caring for creation, we are practicing resurrection, and we are bringing healing to our world. As we continue in this Easter season, I invite you to wonder about where you are *witnessing* resurrection around you and where you are *practicing* resurrection. It might just surprise you how alive Christ truly is.


#### Friday All Recovery Meeting and Drop-In Recovery Coach Support






Join young adults from across the diocese in ntentionally making space in the middle of Lent for quiet, prayer, creativity, and friendship. This is a free program!
