### From the Pastor

Dear Faithful Friends,

Most of the readers of The Quest have heard that I am retiring from active church ministry at the end of October. ## We Walk to End Hunger

October 2, 1 PM at the United Methodist Church of Greenfield, will find many of us walking in the Franklin County CROP Hunger Walk with other people of faith from the area. This is the community fundraising event for Church World Service (<a href="www.cwsglobal.org">www.cwsglobal.org</a>). You can also get the link when you visit our new Trinity Church website (<a href="www.trinityshelburnefalls.org">www.trinityshelburnefalls.org</a>) on or after September 1st!! Our website will also have detailed information on donating and all the options available. Checks are preferred instead of cash made out to CWS/CROP.

Clare and Lois will be available after the service each Sunday in September to give you a Walker Donation envelope. Walkers are encouraged to approach family and friends, neighbors, and coworkers, to raise money for this worthy cause. Twenty five percent of monies raised will return to Franklin County, another 25% remains in this country and 50% of monies raised are used globally. This year will see money going to Haiti where the people are still recovering from last year's hurricane, and Ukraine, which needs no explanation.

Lois has placed canisters in various stores in Shelburne Falls, as another way to get donations. There is also a QUILT RAFFLE and tickets will be available after service each Sunday in September with the drawing on the day of the walk, October 2nd! We have raised over \$400 to date! Let's see how much money Trinity Church can raise to help alleviate hunger here at home and around the world.

The walk itself will be easier than most because it is on flat terrain. Come join us as we wear our red jackets, walking as The Red Wave of Hope, from Trinity Church!
