# Pastor's Perch

Some of you know that the former Bangor Theological Seminary hosted a grant competition for small churches in Northern New England. Trinity was one of five churches selected to participate.

One of the great things that happens is we learn about what is going on with five other congregations, all similar to ours. We are small in a large way, populist in a people centered way, have special talents like our gorgeous singing and music and our elder as a blended denominational congregation.

The project is nicknamed REFUGIA, which is a great word for what we do. We think and learn together about refuge and the calm of safe spaces.

You have read enough about what ON BEING Host Krista Tippett thinks about being in a Kairos moment as a species. (Her Critical Yeast was one of our assignments in the Refugia program. You might want to listen to it.) <u>Here is a link to it.</u>

A friend and teacher to On Being, John Paul Lederach, gives us an image we can all use, whether at Trinity or not. It is "critical yeast." He points out that when we think about how change happens in this society — and this is natural — we tell the story of those moments when critical mass arises: bodies on the street. But wherever John Paul has been, in these many places that have moved through many different kinds of conflict, preceding and leading — over years and decades and perhaps even longer — to the critical mass, there is what he calls critical yeast. This is, as he defines it, "small groups of people in unlikely combinations, in a new quality of relationship." Importantly, he also says that it's this critical yeast, it's these yeasty individuals who are there in the society after the upheaval of the critical mass, who also turn what has been upended into long-term transformation. Tippett gives us a second image from John Paul that is perhaps a way to begin to take this into your body, to feel it and not just believe it. A teacher of his named Elise Boulding, also a great sociologist, spoke about what she called the "200-year present" that in fact each of us inhabits.

Your 200-year present, if you'd like to do this thought experiment, begins with the year of the birth of the oldest person you knew when you were a child. For me, that would have been my great-grandmother, Susanna Lower, who was in her 90s in the 1960s. And then the other boundary of that 200-year present would be the hundredth birthday of the youngest person you have held in your arms. For most of us, that's going to be about a 200-year present that touches our lives directly and that we directly touch.

Trinity church lives in a 200-year present with most of your neighbors, perhaps with yourself. It's time to get yeasty. We so hope you will think of joining or rejoining Trinity on October 15th, when we receive new members. Call me if you are interested - (413) 687-1937. We also hope you will want to be a part of a small group of people who are an unlikely combination. We hope you will want to be a part of the past, the present and the future of this beloved community we inhabit together.

Come to church on September 24 if you want to hear your peers tell me more about this important project. 10 a.m. No dress code. Bring yourself. That's what we need.

#### **BOOK STUDY**


#### **OFFERED BY LOIS BASCOM**

## Tuesdays 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. September 19 Through Oct. 24.

A book, the Rock, the Road and the Rabbi by Kathie Lee Gifford and Rabbi Jason Sobel.

I have been reading this book and found the Bible come to life for me in a way that brings excitement. Words lost their meanings in the translation from Greek or Hebrew to English, thus changing the message of Jesus, in many instances.

In this study, we journey to the Holy Land via DVD, use a Study Guide and the book itself, the Rock, the Road and the Rabbi. This six week, one hour study will enable us to journey



deeper into our faith by including information about the times, Jewish culture, and geography in which the Bible was written.

As Kathie Lee Gifford shares her story coauthor Rabbi Jason Sobel, a messianic Jewish rabbi, provides fascinating background details that make the story of the New Testament come alive. Jesus (the Rock) came into this world and walked the lands of Israel (the Road) to show us the way to God. And when we are introduced to the mysteries of God's Word (the Rabbi) and understand it in the context in which it was written, radical transformation begins to renew our hearts and minds.

The book study includes video discussion questions, Bible exploration and personal study and reflection materials for in-between sessions.

It is recommended that participants purchase the Study guide and preferably the book as well. The book itself can be borrowed from a library. Give yourself plenty of time to request it, as it might be an inter library loan. Also, I can make copies of the pages we use in each session and copies of the short chapters that are recommended to read before each session, saving you money.
