I am grateful to report that I had many opportunities over the past few months to rest and reflect, visit friends and family, go on adventures, and store up some vitamin D and warmth for the winter! It is especially exciting that our beloved Bridge of Flowers reopened in August and now we have the joy of watching it grow each time we walk through town!

Some years, the end of summer feels bittersweet, but this year, I'm excited for all that is in store for us in the coming seasons. But before we go into all the details, I'd like to take a personal privilege to celebrate with you two new adventures that I'm beginning this month. First, I'm excited to announce that I've been chosen to participate in a year-long cohort called EcoPreacher. This cohort, offered by the BTS Center, Creation Justice Ministries, and Lexington Theological Seminary, offers monthly sessions to help preachers understand climate change and other environmental justice issues more deeply as spiritual crises that require creative, faith-rooted action. I am very grateful to the Starkey Scholarship Committee who invited me to apply for and awarded me a scholarship for this first year of study. I'm grateful for all the support I've received from all of you and look forward to taking you all along on my seminary journey these next few years.


Money raised goes to World Food Organizations and money also goes to theses local agencies: The Western Mass Food Bank, The Survival Center



WHAT'S PASTOR BEN READING?

Each month in the Quest, I intend to include this new column: "What's Pastor Ben Reading?" My hope is that it can become an invitation into a conversation. Perhaps what I'm reading will peak your interest to either read it yourself, or start a conversation with me about what I'm reading. Sometimes, like this month, it will just be something that I've picked up myself; other months, I intend to share books or articles that I'm reading in seminary. While I can't always promise a quick turnaround time, I'm always grateful when you send me links to articles, videos, or books that you've found useful, too!

This month, in preparation for the upcoming talk with Jim Wallis (see article below), I'm reading his book from April 2024 titled *The False White Gospel: Rejecting Christian Nationalism, Reclaiming Truth Faith, and Refounding Democracy*. The book opens with a bit of history and defining of White Christian Nationalism and then the rest of the book focuses on specific passages from the Bible about neighbors, loyalty, discipleship, community, and peacemaking. Last fall, I read John Meacham's *The Soul of America: The Battle for Our Better Angels,* which talks about America's history through the lens of race. I found that Wallis' book seamlessly built upon Meacham's work and is a prophetic call to action for the Church. I highly encourage you to sign up for Wallis' talk on September 18th and if you get a chance, read this book in advance!

We are honored to welcome **Jim Wallis** as our featured speaker. A leading voice in public theology and social justice, Wallis serves as the inaugural **Archbishop Desmond Tutu Chair in Faith and Justice** at Georgetown University's McCourt School of Public Policy, where he also directs the new **Center on Faith and Justice**.

Wallis is the founder of Sojourners, a bestselling author, and a nationally recognized advocate for faith in action. His latest book, *The False White Gospel: Rejecting Christian Nationalism, Reclaiming True Faith, and Refounding Democracy* (April 2024), has sparked widespread discussion on the role of faith in confronting extremism and rebuilding a more just society. His past leadership includes service on President Obama's first **White House Advisory Council on Faith-based and Neighborhood Partnerships**, and recognition by Washingtonian magazine as one of **D.C.'s 500 most influential policy shapers** in both 2022 and 2023.

Join us as we reflect on how Christian communities can respond faithfully, courageously, and prophetically to the growing threat of Christian nationalism.
